Bored online chat rooms

As a freshman at university in 2000, I remember struggling mightily to pay my 400-minute monthly cell phone bill. I tried to maintain a long-distance relationship with my boyfriend, but our time to speak was limited due to his packed baseball schedule, my two jobs, and, most of all, the fact that we'd only been dating for a month before going to separate schools. He is my husband now - so it all worked out - but back then we needed to be able to get to know each other in a world that seemed to stack up against us. Thankfully, that changed when a colleague introduced me to a free online video chat company. I don't remember the name of the company, and I'm sure it's long since extinction and was replaced by newer evolutions, but back then it opened up my world in ways I never dreamed possible. It gave me the opportunity to spend hours talking to my boyfriend face to face - even though we lived more than 200 miles apart. While I'd like to think that my relationship would have survived nine months apart even if video chat wasn't around, there's no way to know for sure. What I do know is that the video chat industry continues to revolutionize the way people interact on both a personal and professional level, and it remains an important part of my life as an online entrepreneur. While it's come a long way since it was a child at the turn of the millennium, I'm constantly amazed by how people so often don't make the most of it. Popular video chat service There are many video chat services, but the following is one of the most popular: Skype Skype is a mostly free video chat, file sharing, and instant messaging service owned by Microsoft. It can absolutely be used the most, the most famous among the bunch. Calling from your computer to your computer is free, but if you want to make a mobile or land phone call from your Skype service, you have to pay a fee. For U.S. customers, these fees range from \$3 to \$14 per month. I use Skype to host video interviews with guests from around the world for a weekly podcast. Google Hangouts Google Hangouts is a bit buggy, but a great option for individuals who want to organize large, private conference calls or who want to stream interviews from the live video chat function to the YouTube channel. For example, when I helped organize the Well Summit Blog online conference series (aimed at health and wellness bloggers and focused on blog design, branding, and development), we organized our live interview tables through Google Hangouts. Our viewers can watch and participate by participating on YouTube, Google Hangouts, or the Blog Well Summit website (Google owns and runs YouTube, which allows Hangout leaders to link their accounts and stream Hangouts to YouTube). Hangout leaders can also embed a live stream on any site, as we did with our Well Summit Blog interview boards. Google Hangouts is currently free. FaceTime FaceTime is Apple's answer to video chat services. Announced in 2010 and officially launched in 2011, 2011, allows Apple device users to engage in live video chats, as long as their iOS device has a forward-facing camera. FaceTime is free whenever you connect to Wi-Fi, but data charges apply when you use it on a mobile data network. The reason for improving video chat makes the world a seemingly smaller place. In 2005, I was interviewed for a job in a different state, and potential employers went to great lengths to set up a video conference job interview so we could chat in person before moving further along in the process. We both had to work with local community colleges to arrange conference rooms where we could hook into the internet service of schools and use their cameras to chat. Today, of course, this will not be a problem. In fact, in 2010 I participated in a cross-state job interview and had no problems at all in connecting and chatting with potential employers via Skype. Video chat makes it possible to stay in touch with friends and family, connect with business partners, and organize meetings with people you've never met before. Not a week goes by where I don't use video chat for one reason or another, and because my work depends on it, my husband and I have mastered the science of high-quality video chats. In fact, we were getting so good at finding awesome on camera that I always get praise on our set. Although it is possible to pass with sub-video quality, interactive quality, your professional level and even the business opportunities you are offered can expand as you improve it. Think about the halo effect. In essence, it is the idea that when someone makes a favorable or unfavorable impression of someone or something, that impression is then transferred to other, non-related aspects of the same person or that. For example, if you visit a beautifully designed and easy-to-navigate website, you're more likely to assume that the content is also of high quality, even if that's not necessarily true. On video chat, if your image is clear and your sound is good, the people at the other end are more likely to assume you've got your actions together and are interested in what they're saying. Obviously, the halo effect is not ines mistakes. You can still spoil things by saying something messy or un prepared for your online meeting. However, when you improve the video quality, you tilt the scales in a beneficial direction. How to improve the quality of lucky videos, improving the quality of your videos is surprisingly easy. Use the following tips to impress the person at the other end of the connection. 1. Head into a low-quality HD Webcam, built-in webcam leaving you with a grainy, low light look. A few years ago, my husband and I bought an external HD webcam for \$99 from Logitech (the same model is currently available for about \$75), and it greatly improved our video chat clarity. External webcams may not be ideal if you're chatting on a mobile device, but they're strong enough clips to laptops or desktops and they can make a real difference in your videos. 2. Pay attention to back-lighting A sure way to hurt the quality of your video is to sit with your back to a window or a bright light. When the light shines towards the back and into the camera lens, it makes everything in the fore scene - it's you - show dark. By rotating your computer so that you are side illuminated or illuminated in front, you can immensely improve your image. 3. Give yourself a backdrop of love camera backgrounds. Relying on a wall while chatting online can feel comfortable, but it makes it harder for the person at the other end of the conversation to draw visual views. Trying to choose a wall or background provides some contrast without being too busy – but, more importantly, provides space between your body and the background. Consider chatting in a location a few meters from the wall with something visually interesting on it, like a work of art. Just remember that if your desk or floor is showing up in the background, go ahead and make sure your space is neat. 4. When appropriate, buy really good video lighting including an object bathed in natural light derived from behind the camera. Setting up your conversation in front of an open, sunny window is one way to achieve this effect, but if you have difficulty controlling the lighting in your place, you can always create fake natural light. Since a lot of our business conversations are organized through Google Hangouts and Skype, my husband and I decided to invest in the Softbox Lighting Toolbox. We cost \$200 for a full set of three professional lights, but if video chat isn't an important part of your business, you might be able to get away with a few well-placed lights that you already have at home. 5. Make sure you have a good connection I will never forget a Skype interview I hosted, where the person at the other end set up his computer on a shared connection at a busy Starbucks. It's a disaster. Her connection is poor, her videos keep freezing up, and the background noise is so annoying that it's hard to hear what she has to say. At all costs, try to organize your video chat through a high-speed, personal Internet connection that won't incur the bandwidth usage of shared Internet users. Additionally, turning off any other programs may affect the bandwidth needed to maintain high-quality calls. For example, it is not a good idea to download files while video chat. Finally, understand that cable Internet companies usually only promise download speeds up to the point where you're paying. So if you are paying for a speed of up to 10 Mbps, you can only get one or two Mbps in time peak of the day. This is because cable lines are often shared - if everyone in your block comes home and starts streaming Netflix at 6pm on Monday, the download speed for everyone will decrease. If you're using cable Internet, try scheduled your video chat during non-peak times or review faster Internet speeds. When I started working full-time at home, I realized that our 10 Mbps service didn't cut it anymore – that's when we upgraded to 50 Mbps, and now we're down to spoiled with up to 300 Mbps. Using a Wired Internet Connection You almost always get better Internet speeds when you are plugged into a wired Internet connection. These save you from the difficult nature of some wireless connections that kick you offline without warning. When my husband and I started getting serious about our podcast back in March, we knew we had to set up a dedicated computer with a wired Internet hookup. While we had to rearrange the location of our router, it was well worth it – after more than 100 interviews, we didn't lose a single video call (at least at our end). Maximize your online appearance Almost no one looks as good on video as they do in real life. The camera washes you out and squashes you down from 3D to 2D, and it doesn't always play well in your favor. So even though I don't wear makeup often, I almost always put some on before hosting a video chat. Plus, I can see myself in video play back when I'm talking to other people and if I don't like the way I look, it can be annoying. Here are a few ways I pumped up the volume on my appearance. I don't go so far as to layer on makeup to the point where it looks completely un natural, but because I put on more than I usually wear, I end up feeling made up. Don't worry, though - this overdone effect is actually played down on camera. I'm a woman, but these tips can also work for boys, especially in professional online meetings when appearances are most important: 7. Wear a Foundation I'm an IT cosmetics fanatic, and I love its Celebration Foundation Illumination powder. Because it's a powdery foundation, it's practically impossible to apply too much or miss a spot - perfect for boys or girls who are not used to makeup. Subtle lighting adds a light to the skin that actually turns on the camera. Plus, it evens out skin tones and hides wrinkles and wrinkles very effectively. You don't need to use IT cosmetics to get the same effect – just use the platform you best meet based on your age, skin type and natural color. The key here is to create an evenly colored skin, so experiment with colored moisturizers, liquid foundations or powder foundations. 8. Apply concealer to your wrinkles Go ahead and apply your favorite concealer to circle under your eyes and blemishes, but go a step further and put some wrinkles around your nose and mouth. I love IT Cosmetics' Bye Bye Under Eye concealer because it's thick compared to other concealer, and it does a great job of evening out wrinkles that might otherwise be seen on camera. Not to mention, a little goes a long way – I got a tube a few years ago that I still use. 9. Use Bronzer Because the camera washes you out, it's up to you to create facial contours. Apply a bronzer on yours Along the ridge of your nose, and behind your jaw line to help create size. 10. Wear a Little More Makeup Than Usual I don't abuse my makeup because I still want to look natural, but I add an extra dab of color to my cheek apples, put on a layer of lipstick and lip gloss, and wear eyeliner and mascara. If you regularly wear reasonable makeup, you should slightly enhance the camera to look like yourself. 11. Do your hair There is no reason to go into the sea here, but you should do something with your hair so it looks like you have made an effort. If you're like me, you're constantly fighting fly-aways and bedheads. Consider buying an over-eared headset - head bandages and bulkier headphones do wonders to hide hair problems. 12. Wear a plain head contrasting your skin and background You want the person at the other end of the video chat to pay attention to your face, not to print wild on top of you. Like that, you don't want to wear a shirt too close to the tone for your skin or background because you don't want to fade into your surroundings. Choose a unique contrast color for you to turn on from the screen. Just keep the cuts and design simple. 13. Dress for the occasion If you are attending an online job interview, wear a suit. If you are going out with friends, wear what you usually wear socially. If you are meeting a lover for the first time, dress nicely and flaunt your assets without going into the sea. Just because you're at home in bed doesn't mean you should wear your pajamas when chatting videos. 14. Wearing proper pants I know there is a strong temptation when chatting online to pair a matching top of running shorts because the person at the other end of the conversation can not see under your waist. Believe me, I understand the temptation. The problem is, you never know when you might have to stand up and do something while streaming the video, alerting other viewers to the business outfit at the top, below. I have a few pairs of black pants that look like business outfits, but really the stretch yoga pants that I keep on hand just on these occasions. I have two last tips, and it's incredibly important to find your best on camera: 15. Do not mess with your interface Because you can watch your own video feed in your online chat, you may notice every strand of hair falling out of place. Avoid the temptation to mess with your hair, clothes, or makeup while on camera. The most annoying video I've ever seen is one where the woman constantly plays with her own hair and calls attention to her hair. You won't do it in a live chat because you won't be able to see yourself - don't do it when chatting online. Put yourself together before you start streaming, then accept whatever you look like in your conversation. 16. Look at the camera, not that this screen has done a lot of practice, but it's something I've getting very good at – I'm just looking at computer screen when the person on the other end is talking. When it was my turn to talk, I turned my eyes directly to the camera so that the folks on the other side of the conversation got the impression that I was looking them in the eye. If you look at the screen instead of the camera, the screen may appear as if you are looking down, instead of looking at the corresponding friend. Don't ignore the important sound as it is for you to look beautiful on camera, it is equally important – maybe more importantly – that your voice is clear and understandable. You can easily improve your audio by investing in a headset with an external microphone. This provides better sound and cuts the noise around the microphone of your computer capable of receiving. In addition, using headphones helps to reduce speaker feedback. If you don't wear headphones while chatting online, your computer microphone takes someone else's voice from the speaker and creates a feedback loop. This is annoying and really hard to edit if you happen to be involved in a professional interview. Use headphones with built-in external microphones. You can pick up a pair for less than \$50 from Amazon, such as the Sades Floating Audio Gaming Headset with Microphone that costs about \$30. We actually use a separate external microphone, so my headphones - the I-MEGO Throne Combo headphones - don't have a built-in microphone, but I absolutely love them. A pair costs \$80, but it's the only pair I've found that ultimately doesn't give me a headache from wearing extensions. Last Words If you haven't jumped on the video chat bandwagon, it's only a matter of time. Whether you skype with your kids while they're in college, FaceTime with your best friend while she travels abroad, or join a Google Hangout as part of an online workout program, video chat is becoming the norm for building long-distance relationships. Make your experience as good as possible by perfecting the quality of your video chat today. Do you use online video chat regularly? How do you maximize the experience? Experience?
